## Ofsted summary



- Main findings-areas to improve further
- Safeguarding policies and procedures not robust.
- Behaviour management inconsistent.
- Results in KS1 not the national standard.
- Inconsistencies in Teaching and Learning.
- Curriculum not broad and balanced.

## Ofsted summary



### Main findings-strengths

- Results in KS2 at or above National
- Phonics results above National
- EYFS data in line with National and children ready for KS1
- School rated in the top 5 in Lincolnshire for attainment for all



### Safeguarding

- Policies updated and improved.
- New Designated Safeguarding Lead- Mrs Richards- oversees all of safeguarding.
- Displays around school for staff and children.
- Enhanced medical needs training for staff.
- Beginning and end of the day procedure enhanced/developed including parental consent on collection information

### Safeguarding

- External review of safeguarding and governance already scheduled.
- Strengthening policies to offer early help assessments to parents.



- Nurture team was positive (meet and greet, Young carers, monitoring of behaviour trackers, Friends program)
- Breakfast club was a safe and happy place
- Pupils felt safe and were very polite with good manners.
- Leaders responded quickly with an action plan



#### Behaviour

- New behaviour lead-Mrs Hoyland with a clear brief to lead all aspects of behaviour.
- Reinforcing expectations at all times of the day including changeovers.
- Working closely with outside agencies to ensure high quality support to compliment school systems.
- Renewed focus on rewards.
- Attendance strategy strengthened.
- E-safety squad and junior online safety team trained and effective.

## Behaviour

 New behaviour and reward policy will ensure consistent standards across the school.



- Attendance is improving
- Teacher generally sorted out bullying incidents. "Every day is anti-bullying day."



#### Teaching and learning and outcomes

- Maths and English lead, leadership time each week to model, monitor and challenge their subject.
- New senior leader role as Teaching and Learning lead-Mrs North.
- Regular lesson drop ins and book reviews with feedback for staff.
- Daily timetable changed to allow for more humanities and arts.
- KS1 data predicted to improve.



- Maths is a clear strength of the school.
- Key stage 2 show progress over time.
- TAs used effectively
- Evidence of cross-curricular work.
- Standards in writing is showing improvement.
- Good vocabulary focus in reading.
- Leaders have tackled standards in KS2 reading
- More-able readers are now being challenged.
- All readers enjoyed reading; phonics well used.
- Reading skills were fluent.
- Capacity for change within the leadership team.



- Programs are in place for reading and writing; progress seen in the data.
- Rapid journeys showed rapid progress over time.
- Progress was seen in books. Looks like children are challenged at national.
- Positive pockets of teaching and learning throughout the school.
- Homework was seen as a positive over both key stages.
- Lots of writing opportunities and evidence in year 6.
- Pupils are prepared for life in modern Britain.
- Children's social, moral, spiritual and culture education is developed appropriately.
- Children setting own challenge and show perseverance and determination.



#### **EYFS**

- Key workers assigned in Early Years.
- Children have timetabled outside provision.



- Excellent use of the sensory tent.
- Effective learning seen in Early Years.
- High quality questioning and knowledge from staff.
- Early years pupil premium appropriately spent-speech therapist.

- Nurture follow up and outcome phone call
- Website updated to reflect changes as well as social media.
